Redbud (Cercis canadensis)

Origin: Native.

<u>Status in Park</u>: Widespread; bluffs, slopes, well-drained bottomland, and field edges; often in groups.

<u>Characteristics</u>: Small tree, up to 35 feet in height and 1 foot in diameter; crown usually broad and flattened; bark reddish brown, separating into long plates and thin scales; flowers are rose-purple, about ½ inch long, and growing in clusters; fruits are pods, up to 4 inches long, brown in color when mature, containing several seeds.

<u>Leaves</u>: Alternate, simple; up to 6 inches long with smooth edges; deep green color; surface above is smooth, beneath it is smooth or may have some hairs.

<u>Notes</u>: Redbud is a familiar tree used in landscaping. The beautiful flowers enhance yards in spring.
